General Business

 N6CES Tower Project: A big crew showed up to help raise the tower and secure it in place on 18 February. The tower was raised and secured. Initial tests showed very high SWR. The feed line may be the culprit. That will need to come down and be replaced with an alternate ... which is on hand. Also, the wind storm the following week made it

- apparent that more guy lines would be a good idea. So progress has been made but there is still some work to be done.
- Greg N7IAD and Susan W7MXW attended a meeting with the City of Edmonds emergency preparedness group in order to better understand the city's needs and how our club might fit into their plans. They gave a brief review of the meeting.
- We spent some time discussing our emergency plans, such as they are, and how we could fit in with the city's emergency plans.
- The general consensus was that our club is not really dedicated to emergency planning and preparedness. We do want to support the city in the case of disasters (storms, floods, train wrecks, etc) where normal communications infrastructure has been compromised. We do not anticipate being involved in emergencies such as active shooter, or other situations in which normal communications are still up and running. We decided to work on our intra-club communications so that we can act as a somewhat coordinated group that can provide some measure of communications capability. We have tentative plans to run another simplex connectivity test, date and time to be announced. It was suggested that we run the simplex test while connecting via Zoom so that we can all see who is connecting to whom. The results of the test would then be distilled into a connectivity matrix.
