Ham Radio Intro:

Ed presented a short slide show from the ARRL website for the benefit of a visiting Cub Scout leader who was interested to hear more about Amateur Radio and how it might be of interest to his scout troop. In addition to Amateur Radio the options of GMRS and FRS radios were discussed as ways to get more hands-on radio experience for unlicensed radio operators.

Monthly Presentation:

SDR Console explanation and demonstration by Ed N7PHY. Ed brought in his latest radio roving apparatus which was quite impressive even before he explained all the bits and pieces. The basic idea is that SDR Console is a fancy software program (free for non-commercial use) which provides a user interface for an SDR (Software Defined Radio). The software plus SDR provides the receiver part of the setup. Ed uses his Kenwood TS-590SG as the transmitter. There are a lot of extra bits and pieces needed to make this all work as it should. Briefly, the received signal comes from the antenna then goes through an SDR Switch, a Low Noise Amplifier, a 6 meter Bandpass Filter, followed by a Variable Attenuator before going to the AirSpy R2 Software Defined Radio and the SDR Console program. Transmissions are sent from the Kenwood TS-590SG to the SDR Switch and on to an amplifier before hitting the antenna. The SDR Switch handles isolating the receiver hardware from the transmitter hardware. Best to see Ed N7PHY if you need more details.
